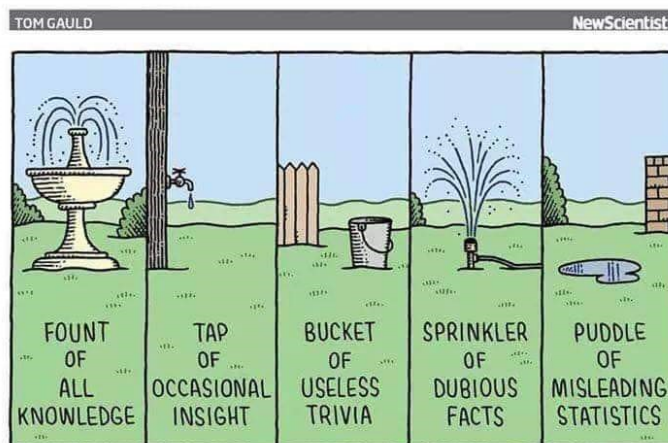
Moreton Food and Wine Festival
